Gary "Guitar" Williams from Dayton, Ohio plays rhythm and lead guitar. He formerly played with Stach & Co., a splinter group from "The Ohio Players." He led his own band before going with "The Blue Invaders." He has been performing for 20 years and says his main influences are T-Bone Walker, Chuck Berry, Buddy Guy, Albert Collins, Jimi Hendrix, and Rory Gallagher. His desire this already hot band. The great Jimmy Johnson said of Tim one night after hearing him play, "That boy is too young to know how great he really is."

On drums is Tim "Pocket" Barton. Tim is from Middletown, Ohio and although he's young, he is by no means a newcomer to the blues scene. He has played with many great musicians such as Bo Diddley, B.B. King, Johnny Winter, Sunnyland Slim, Big Time Sarah, Jimmy Johnson, Willie Pooche, Bone Chillun', and The Nite Prowlers.

Next is Thomas "Harpoon Man" Henry on harmonica. Harpoon has performed for 15 years professionally sometimes as harmonica player, guitar player, saxophone player, and lead vocalist. He has played with B.B. King, Bobby Blue Bland, Vanishing Point, Shokin' Joe, The Jitters, Slash Wildly, Slaves To Pain and Bam-Ba-Lam. He doesn't play conventional harp and has a unique style that

On saxophone is Tumust "2 Sax" Allison. Tumust has studied and taught music at Antioch College, and University of Akron both in Ohio. Sometimes Tumust plays two horns simultaneous explaining how his nickname was derived. Occasionally Tumust will, much to the audiences delight, play flute.
