She was with a band called Hot Links, and Snyder has written a review of an album on Arhoolie Records, You Know That's Right, by Katie Webster and Hot Links. Nancy and her tenor sax are also featured on the album. It's her recording debut.

In talking of the record, Snyder said,

"Piano woman and vocalist Webster swings through mellow, slow blues and hard-driving boogie-woogie on this her fifth LP. She wrote most of the material. Snyder's other big item was that SNAPPER MITCHUM, who played bass for SON SEALS out of Chicago for about 10 years, is now living in Dayton.
