By music industry standards, he is a true artist and has been sought after to play bass for Buddy Guy, Junior Wells, Johnny Dollar, Clarence Gatemouth Brown, Koko Taylor and Muddy Waters, just to name a few. While "Snapper's" associations and credits are an impressive indication of his talent as a musician, there is no substitute for hearing him take the stage himself.

"Snapper" led Son Seals and Lacy Gibson for years, having recorded Live 'N Burning and Chicago Fire with Son Seals on the Midnight Sun label. You can also hear "Snapper's" distinctive sound on the Alligator Records 20th Anniversary Blues Compilation CD and the Grammy-nominated Blues Deluxe album recorded live at the Chicago Blues Festival. "Snapper" has had some memorable moments sharing the stage with A.C. Reed, Johnny Winter, Stevie Ray Vaughn, Albert Collins, John Mayail, Paul Butterfield and many others.

The man lives to perform and looks forward to his Louisville gig. And when "Snapper" takes the stage, there is always a strong possibility that any one of his musical friends will make a guest appearance!

Doors open for this concert at 7 p.m., and the show should begin no later than 9:30 p.m. Tickets


Squire Boone Caverns and Village
